

Getting here

The Met is on Market Street in Bury town centre, **BL9 0BW**. We are about 50 metres from Bury interchange, meaning Metrolink or local bus services are a great way to get to and from shows.

We don't have a car park, but there's plenty of on street parking in Bury (including blue badge bays directly opposite), or Bolton Street Car Park is the nearest main car park (search BL9 ODL).

Tickets for all shows are available directly from The Met. The price you see listed will be the price you pay, without additional transaction fees. A postage fee of £1.50 applies to all tickets posted.
